

The testimonies keep coming!

In March and April we were traveling 2-3 times a week to a district an hour away to evangelize with several other Christians. There were countless opportunities open to us, as there always is when you live in a country where 25% of the people have never even heard the name Jesus.



We set up in a busy market, watching as dozens of people surrounded us and listened to our praise and worship. We proclaimed the Gospel, **the good news of Jesus and His sacrifice for humanity**, and watched as some walked on while others stayed and continued to listen. We talked to the people in the booths around us, the people who had heard everything that we had spoken over our speaker.



In the next few days we went to other market places and set up on open corners proclaiming the Gospel. Then we went out and talked with the people who had gathered. **A couple of the Thai believers, who were working with us, came back with testimonies of people accepting Jesus.**

Street evangelism has always been exciting for me as I get to meet many people, and not only tell them about Jesus, but talk with them and create relationship. But what I most enjoy is going into the hospital and talking with the patients and families there.

Several people in the hospital were dying, without hope of returning home. Their families were very willing to tell us everything that was wrong with them and how long the doctor said they had left to live. We walked around and visited each bed and spoke with each person telling them that **Jesus Christ could heal them**, sharing with them testimonies of people we knew who Jesus had also healed. What surprised me is that the people who were sick or dying listened and asked questions and wanted to hear more, whereas their family members around them sometimes criticized us. One woman told me, **"My mother doesn't want to hear this, she's Buddhist,"** yet when I spoke to her mother, she had the opposite reaction.

We saw many accept Jesus in the hospital, and we prayed for healing with every single one of them. They were all willing to receive prayer and when asked if they believed Jesus could heal them, they all said, "I do." **We saw so many people healed** that to tell *all* the testimonies would make for too long a letter.



But the testimonies keep coming. We keep hearing how another one of the people we had prayed for is now healed and is able to return home, and that the Thai believers up there are visiting them every week and discipling them.

The most recent testimony came earlier this month. There was a lady who was in the last stage of cancer. When we approached her bed, her sister told me that she had cancer in her intestines, and she suddenly pulled up her sister's shirt to show me the scars on her stomach. At the time the woman had fallen asleep because of some pills the nurse had just given her, so I told her sister, **"Jesus can heal her,"** and went on to tell her about His healing power. The lady could not wake because of the medicine, but we laid hands on her and prayed that the cancer leave her body right then in the name of Jesus. The family thanked us and we went to another bed across the room.



About half an hour later we saw that the woman was awake and sitting up. We went and spoke with her again for a few minutes, telling her everything about Jesus. We left her with the statement that Jesus had healed her. This was about four weeks ago when we had prayed for her.

We received news that she has gone home and that she is completely well!

"Give glory to God!" the Thai believers are telling her. She happens to live in the same village as another lady from the hospital who had accepted Jesus that day. The church up there has started a weekly Bible study in that village and are discipling the two ladies as well as telling their families and neighbors about Jesus.

Praise God for His amazing power!

As many of you may know, we are planning to go the States in July. Ariya and I are moving there to study physical therapy and go to Bible College. Our dad and Mew are going for a few months to raise funds and share the vision God has given us. We hope to receive many invitations to visit and simply be given an opportunity to share what we plan to begin in the next year, as well as encourage the believers there with countless testimonies we have from being on the mission field.
